Course Guidelines

A. **Course Registration** – To register for the course the participants must submit an online registration form located at <http://www.usd-online.org/inted.htm> (University of San Diego) or <http://www.ashland.edu/pds/sp-offerings.php> (Ashland University). The registration deadline is **February 10, 2006**.

B. **Course Requirements**

1. All teachers are required to attend all classes.
2. All teachers are required to read the article *Planning Your Website* by Emily Ricketts, Six Steps for Web Design (<http://www.siec.k12.in.us/west/online/steps.htm>) and the Contribute 3 Tutorial by Macromedia.
3. All teachers are required to submit a project at the end of the course. The expected project is the teacher's course website that was developed during the course.

The finished course project must be sent to William Brogan, PSC 819 Box 63, FPO AE 09645 or william.brogan@eu.dodea.edu no later than March 12, 2006. The project should be the finished web site with a cover sheet that includes the course title, course number, location, dates, participant's name and mailing address.

C. **Course Description**

This inquiry-based study group, *Web Site Development II*, is a tutorial in creating web sites using Macromedia software (Dreamweaver and Contribute), Word, and at least one photo editor. Teachers will meet for 90 minutes in a computer lab for tutorials on webpage development and collaborate while building pages for their courses. The finished product will be a website that can be loaded onto our intranet with a link from the home page. This is appropriate for the teachers' classes and is in agreement with DGF Rota High School SILT goals. This course is consistent with improvement efforts, sound teaching and learning principles, as well as school system priorities and academic focus.
